

Each organiser should make their own assessment as to whether their event can go ahead.

The primary concern is the safety and health of riders, helpers, and others in contact with them. This involves adhering to government regulations regarding COVID-19.

You should firstly read the current AUK guidance for your country.

You should also consider whether any restrictions you need to put in place for those reasons make the event unviable. Of course, you may, for personal reasons, not wish to run your event.

If you do want to go ahead, please consult with your regional delegate. You will need to demonstrate that you can implement measures to run your event safely.

Key points include hygiene and distancing measures at the start, finish, and any manned intermediate controls. It might be preferable to have start facilities outside.

Set riders off in batches of no more than 6, or as regulations in your country demand.

You may wish to limit the overall number of entries.

Refer to the AUK Guidance and consider measures to alleviate overcrowding, queues, etc., at controls. Possibilities include allowing a free control within an area (suitable for, e.g., a town with several options for proof of passage); an info control with an answer that is easily seen and remembered. You could accept a gps track: speak to your delegate if you want to do this.
